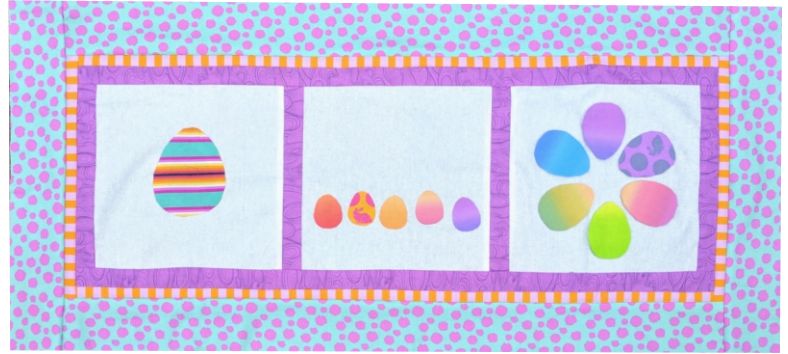
5 - 2-1/4" Eggs

6 - 3-1/2" Eggs

1 - 5-1/2" Eggs

Suggested Fabric Cutting Acrylics:

ACREGG225, ACREGG350, ACREGG550



Fabric:

Paper Pieces: Assortment of fat quarters or scraps

Background: 3/8 yard cut into three 12-1/2" squares

Sashing: 1/4 yard cut into four 2" strips

subcut two of the strips into four 2" x 12-1/2" strips

Inner Border: 1/8 yard cut into three 1-1/2" strips

Outer Border: 1/2 yard cut into four 4" strips

Backing: 55" x 28"

Batting: 55" x 28"

Binding: 1/3 yard cut into four 2-1/2" strips

Fabric Cutting For Paper Pieces:

Lay your Paper Pieces on the wrong side of the fabric and cut around at LEAST 1/4" bigger. Use a dab of fabric glue at this point to temporarily adhere your paper to the fabric for easier basting later.

Quilt Assembly

- 1) Baste your pieces according to the basic instruction sheet.
- 2) For the first block, center the 5-1/2" Egg on the background square. Pin and appliqué in place. (Fig.1)
- 3) For the second block, line up the 2-1/4" Eggs as desired along the bottom of the background square. Pin and appliqué in place. (Fig.2)
- 4) For the third block, arrange the 3-1/2" Eggs in a circle on the background square. Pin and appliqué in place. (Fig.3)
- 5) After each piece has been appliquéd onto a background square, turn to the back side of each block and cut the background fabric 1/4" inside the appliqué stitching lines and remove it. (It is easy to do as the papers will keep you from cutting through the front fabric.) Pull the basting threads and remove the papers from the back side.

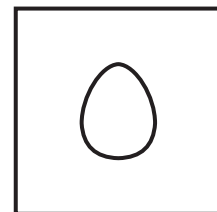

Quilt Assembly Continued

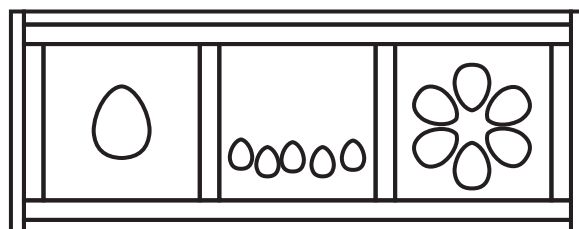
6) Connect the three blocks together using the four 2" x 12-1/2" sashing strips. (Fig.4)



7) Measure the long sides of the quilt top to get the total for the sashing length. Cut two strips this length. Match the middle of the sashing with the middle of the quilt top and pin in place. Sew the into place. (Fig.5)



8) Repeat the measuring process for the inner (Fig.6) and outer (Fig.7) borders.



9) Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired and bind.

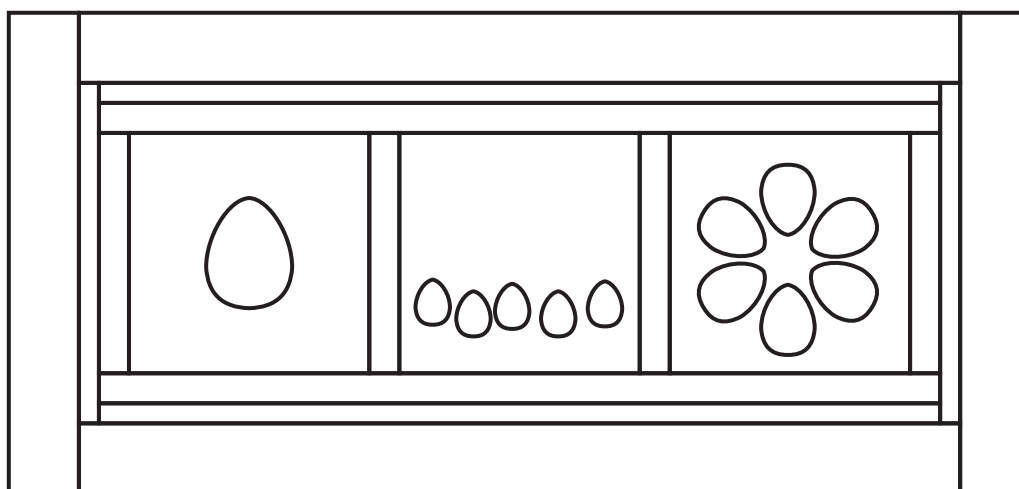
